Prosperity Presbyterian Church Preschool

Our Purpose:

It is the philosophy of Prosperity Presbyterian Church Preschool that early childhood should be a time of fun, warmth, security, exploring and discovery. Preschool children are creative and receptive. The staff strives to nurture and encourage these qualities in the children who attend. The Preschool's purpose is to provide an atmosphere that encourages social, spiritual and creative growth, and the development of the child as a whole.

Christian Emphasis:

Prosperity Presbyterian Church Preschool has a Bible-oriented curriculum that will include memorization and explanation of Bible verses. The children will be exposed to Bible stories and various books that recognize God as the beginning of all true knowledge and which will begin to show them purpose in a complex world. The children will also learn fun Christian music along with action songs.

The preschool uses the Essentials Preschool Curriculum from Gospel Publishing House (www.gospelpublishing.com). The curriculum has a Christian emphasis as well as an academic focus. The 4 year-old-class works out of the Essentials Preschool workbook.

Our Staff:

The staff of Prosperity Presbyterian Preschool treats children with love and respect and with the knowledge of child development that helps enrich each child's day and life. All teachers must love the Lord and be a Christ-like example to their classes. Our teachers are required to have previous classroom experience with children. They are required to be trained annually in infant and adult CPR, first aid, child-protection, and are encouraged to attend preschool workshops during the year. All teachers are selected for Christian character, love of the children, education, experience and training.

Our teachers are available for a parent/teacher conference upon request. Please schedule a time with your child's teacher that is convenient for the both of you.

Policies and Procedures

Classes and Eligibility:

Prosperity Presbyterian Church Preschool has classes for children beginning at age 2.

Three class levels are offered:

The Beginner Class: Children must turn 2 on or before August 31 of the

current school year to enter this class. Children do not have to be potty trained for this class. However, pull-ups (not diapers) and clothing that is easy to get on and off is

preferred.

The Intermediate Class: Children must turn 3 before August 31 of the current

school year. Children must be potty-trained before school

begins for this class.

The Readiness Class: Children must turn 4 on or before August 31 of the

current school year. Children must be potty-trained

before school begins for this class.

Registration:

A completed registration form accompanied by the non-refundable registration fee is required. The fee for the school year is \$150.00 – Siblings are \$90.00. A copy of your child's birth certificate is also due with registration.

Enrollment:

Once the registration for your child has been accepted, your space is reserved until April 25, 2024. Tuition for September must be received by the same date.

If you are registering your child after May 19, 2023, both the registration fee as well as September's tuition will be due when registering.

If the tuition for September is not received at the preschool by 1:00 PM, on or before April 18, 2024, by mail or in person, your space will be considered open and will be filled by a child on the waiting list and the registration fee will not be refunded!

By the first day of school, we also require a medical form from your child's doctor documenting a check-up within the last year and a record of updated immunizations.

Payment Policy:

- 1. Tuition is due by the first of the month, even if your child does not have school on that day by check.
- 2. Any payment not received by the 3rd of the month will have \$20.00 added as a late payment fee, NO EXCEPTION
- 3. Legal action may be taken if necessary. A \$30.00 fee will be charged for all returned checks (bounced checks also).
- 4. In case of a child's withdrawal from Preschool, no refund will be made on tuition already paid. When withdrawing one month's notice is required.

<u>No</u> holidays, field trips, sick days or snow days are deducted from the monthly tuition (which remains the same for each month during the year, regardless of the actual school days).

<u>End of Year Tax Statements</u> – If you require an itemized statement for taxes of your tuition payments, please let us know and we will prepare yours by <u>January 31</u>. Thank you.

Schedule: During the Pandemic the schedule is revised.

Prosperity Presbyterian Church Preschool is open on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9:05 AM – 1:00 PM for the "4's" – 8:45 for "3's" – 8:45 for "2's"

Bring your child on time. NO EXCEPTIONS. We will enforce this rule, and you will have to return home missing that day in Preschool. If you arrive after the time arranged you must bring a late note from your doctor, disabled vehicle etc. and give this note (or send an email) to your teacher or Mrs. Isabelle.

At the end of the school day, please pick your child up promptly on time. Our staff have children of their own they need to pick up after school. A \$1.00 per minute late charge may be imposed after time arranged for repeated tardiness during pickup.

Inclement Weather:

In case of inclement weather, follow the announcements for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS):If CMS is closed, we are closed.

If CMS opens two hours late, we are closed.

If CMS opens one hour late, we will begin at 10:05.

If CMS closes early because of deteriorating weather conditions, please arrange for your child to be picked up as soon as possible!

Health - Safety

Health:

Proof of a check-up by a physician signed by the doctor and an immunization record are due on the first day of school. (Any physical form is acceptable. We do have a copy available upon request.)

No child should attend preschool if they are ill. Do not bring your child to preschool if they have:

fever croup greenish nasal discharge vomiting unidentifiable rash diarrhea

frequent coughing pink eye (conjunctivitis)

feeling too sick to participate in activities

If your child develops symptoms while at preschool, we will call you, and you will be expected to pick them up without delay. If you are unreachable, we will utilize the emergency contacts from your registration form.

If your child will be absent from school, please call and leave a message or email us. Also, report communicable diseases to us.

If your child absolutely must take medication during school, please talk to the director.

Safety:

We ask that you escort your child to their class each morning. While doing so, please do not leave young children or infants unattended in your car. Another parent will usually be very understanding and stand watch over your sleeping baby while you tend to your preschooler. Just ask!

We request that only you, or someone that you have previously identified to the teachers or director, come for your child at the end of each day. To protect your child, he or she will only be released to those with written authorization and identification. Any change of authorized person for pickup must be in writing.

Please park around the circle in front of the church and preschool. When dropping off and picking up your child, you may park on the grass on the far side of the circle under the trees or in the dirt spaces close to the building. We ask that you do not park on the grassy strips on the inside circle near the bushes. Cars have been known to get backed into in these areas. That's never any fun!

Please do not drive around the building because of the danger to students walking to and from the playground and gym.

Parents (or other designated adults) should not be on their cell phones during drop off and pick up times. Preschool staff may need to engage in discussion with the parent.

Parents should be mindful of their children not enrolled in preschool. Please ensure they stay with you for safety reasons and do not run about the school freely or run in and out of the building without you. Every child's safety is important to us.

Lunch – Snacks – Personal Requirements

LUNCH - Please send a nutritious lunch (including a drink) to school with your child that they can eat by themselves. **Do not include any popcorn, candy, or nuts.** Grapes should be cut in half, lengthwise. **Sorry, we can not warm food**.

Please ensure lunch boxes are clean of any spillage and labeled.

SNACKS - Aides will request snacks when needed, one time a year per family.

BIRTHDAYS - For birthdays, small cupcakes or cookies may be shared with the class. Only <u>storebought</u> goodies are permitted. However, we ask that you check with your child's teacher about any food allergies.

Personal Requirements:

Children enrolled in the three-year-old class must be fully potty-trained, and may not wear diapers or pull-ups to school.

Each child is required to have a current immunization record on file. We do not accept unvaccinated children. (routine vaccination).

All children in all classes should bring an extra change of clothes, including socks and shoes if possible, appropriate for the season, in case of an accident. An accident may include spilling something on themselves, so even though your child may not have potty accidents, other accidents may occur.

Cubbies are for school use only. Please check cubbies daily for important information. Any correspondence being placed in cubbies other than from the Preschool or Church must be approved by the director prior to distribution. If you are sending invitations, please include all the children in the class.

Clothing, jacket, hats, and all personal belongings must be plainly <u>marked with your child's name</u> before they bring them to school. We cannot assume responsibility for any unmarked items.

The clothing and shoes worn to school by students should be free of inappropriate words or sayings, and there should be no skulls/crossbones on the clothing. Clothing should fit appropriately and be gender appropriate.

Students need to wear closed-toe-shoes to school, (no sandals or flip flops). This is for their safety. Your child will not be allowed to stay at school if they are in opened-toe-shoes. Children play on the playground and in the gym daily and need the protection of closed-toe-shoes. Girls, please wear panty covers over underwear while wearing dresses.

Pacifiers, blankets, and personal toys are not allowed at preschool for sanitary and social reasons. Please do not allow your child to bring these listed items into the school. (Even during the first few weeks of school.)

Show-and-Tell items are appropriate only on days the teacher specifies. NO PLAY WEAPONS OR TOY GUNS SHOULD BE BROUGHT IN FOR SHOW-AND-TELL.

Field Trips - Discipline - Time Out

Field Trips:

We will take occasional field trips during the year. The cost of the trips will be paid separately from regular tuition. An adult must accompany each child who goes on the field trip. If no adult is available, the preschooler will not be able to be at school on the field trip day. Parents may ask other parents to be responsible for their child that day so that the child is able to go on the field trip. That parent will be responsible for transportation and monitoring that child during the field trip. Please inform the director and your child's teacher if another parent will be responsible for your child that day.

Discipline:

At preschool, we endeavor to communicate clear, simple rules and expectations of appropriate behavior to children. We praise children for positive actions. We try to divert unacceptable behavior to a more appropriate activity.

When discipline is necessary, time out is used. The child is always within sight of the responsible adult. We will communicate with parents when a negative behavior is serious or recurrent. Parental involvement in school discipline provides teamwork that is beneficial in improving behavior of children at school. If the problem continues, the child may be requested to withdraw from the program. Unacceptable behavior such as biting and hitting will not be tolerated.

The time out procedure is as follows:

Disciplinary problems will be dealt with by placing the child in "time out." The child will be placed in a chair in the room within sight of the responsible adult, away from the rest of the children, and will miss current activities for the number of minutes corresponding to their age (2's for 2 minutes, 3's for 3 minutes, 4's for 4 minutes.) In the case of continued and chronic disobedience, the child will be placed in "time-out" in the director's office. "Time-outs" are always supervised, and the child is never alone. The teacher or director will inform the parents of any "time-outs." If the problem continues, the child may be requested to withdraw from the program.

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Behavior Management Program

(Green, Yellow, Red, Light System)



Children will remain on **Green** for good behavior (following classroom rules). If a child displays inappropriate behavior (not following classroom rules), they will receive one warning, but remain on **Green**.



Children will be moved to Yellow if they need to be prompted again to display appropriate behavior. If the child continues to display negative behaviors, the child will receive one additional warning, but remain on Yellow.



Children will be moved to **Red** if they need to be prompted again to display appropriate behavior.

Automatic Red offenses:

Biting
Hitting
Slapping
Aggressive behavior
Disrespectfully yelling at others

Rewards will be at the discretion of the teacher.
